



Yom HaShoah Program at the PJC Wednesday, May 1st, 6:30 p.m.

Join us for this year's *Yom HaShoah* observance, featuring Holocaust survivor Ruth Zimmler. Ms. Zimmler was born in Vienna in 1928. On the evening of November 10, 1938, she and her younger brother - Walter - witnessed the destruction of the largest synagogue in Vienna, their synagogue, during *Kristallnacht*. She was just 10 years old.

In December that same year, their parents were able to put Ms. Zimmler and her brother on the first Kindertransport out of Austria. They were reunited with their parents in America. Ms. Zimmler has told her story of survival to groups and organizations throughout the United States. We hope you will come listen, and bear witness to her incredible story of hope and survival.





PJC Book Notes Adar Adar II 5779 Exodus By Brian Wildsmith

Lushly illustrated, with a compelling narrative, this dramatic retelling of the Exodus story should not be missed.

Wildsmith's gorgeous detail brings to life Egypt under the pharaohs and the world into which Moses was born. It is a story which will engage a child's sense of awe and wonder. Each page is a feast for the eyes and should elicit questions with which you can engage a child with your answers. Its theatricality is key to the child's involvement. The suspense, repetition, and plot twists define the story. They emphasize the tension of the departure from Egypt and highlight the importance of the gift of the Ten Commandments to Moses and the Israelite people.

In the back of the book are a list of suggestions for engaging children with Passover. And, there is even a life-size mock up of a matzah for playing pretend.
