

***Yitzhak Rabin: Soldier, Leader, Statesman* by Itamar Rabinovich**

From Rabin's earliest days as a soldier, it was clear that he could "think out of the box". The Oslo Accords and the Oslo peace process began because Rabin was farsighted enough to understand that the existing stalemate with the Palestinians was untenable. In fact, the peace process died with Rabin's assassination.

This new biography of Yitzhak Rabin, written by one of his closest aides, Itamar Rabinovich, offers original research plus eyewitness recollections. Although more than two decades have passed since Yitzhak Rabin's assassination in 1995, he remains an intriguing and significant modern leader. The first native born Israeli (*sabra*) to become Prime Minister, Rabin's life is intertwined with his nation's pre-state history as well as its modern history.

Rabinovich provides us with interesting new insights into Rabin's relationships with powerful leaders, including President Bill Clinton, Henry Kissinger, and Yasser Arafat. Rabinovich also assesses the fallout after Rabin's murder. On the heels of Rabin's murder by an activist Orthodox Jew, Netanyahu comes to power and there is a surge in Israel's radical right wing.
