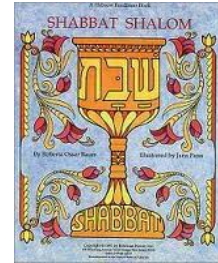

Like Dreamers: The Story of the Israeli Paratroopers Who Reunited Jerusalem and Divided a Nation

by Yossi Klein HaLevi, 2013

Who are the paratroopers depicted in the iconic photograph at the Kotel restoring Jewish sovereignty to the Holy City during the Six-Day War? These Israeli heroes, members of the 55th Brigade, fulfilled the dream of two millennia, while forever changing the history of Israel and the Middle East.

Through extended interviews with seven of these IDF soldiers, veteran journalist Yossi Klein HaLevi weaves a tapestry of modern Israel that humanizes the country's political and cultural dilemmas and renders them more comprehensible.

Some of the most prominent leaders of the settler movement as well as prominent activists in the peace movement emerged from the 55th Brigade. From HaLevi's interviews the reader can hear them argue over the future character of the Jewish state. Should it be Secular Zionist or Messianic Zionist? After fifty years, the argument continues.

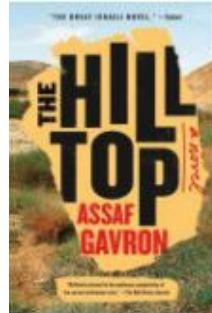

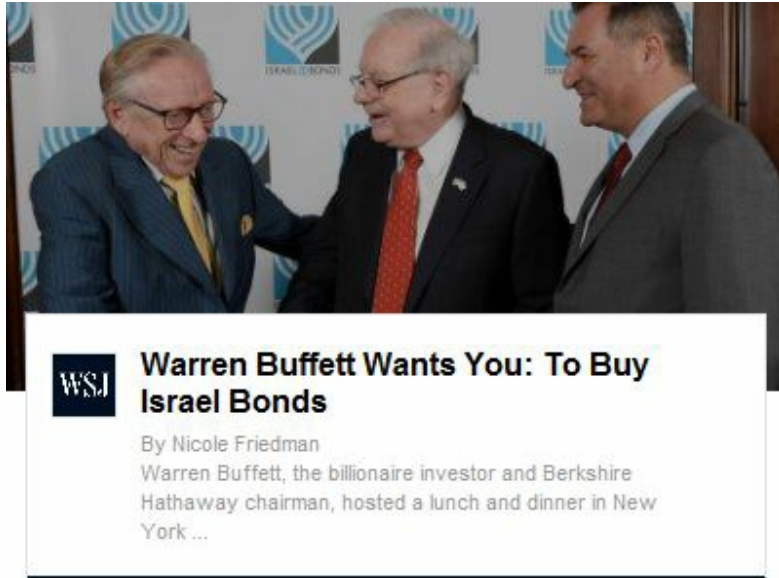
