

- Full College Mailing Street Address (Please, NO P.O. Box addresses. We need as complete/full a street mailing address as possible.)



PJC Book Notes Av/Elul 2018 Sapiens: A Brief History of Humankind By Yuval Noah Harari



In Sapiens: A Brief History of Humankind, Yuval Noah Harari, Professor of History at Hebrew University, spans the whole of human history, from the very first humans to the radical - and sometimes devastating - breakthroughs of the cognitive, agricultural and scientific revolutions. Praised as eminently readable and thought provoking by the likes of Bill Gates and Barack Obama, Harari draws on insights from biology, anthropology, paleontology and economics. Professor Harari 's research explores how the currents of history have shaped our human societies, the animals and plants around us and even our personalities.

The author asks wide-ranging and provocative questions. He wonders whether humans become "happier" as history

unfolds. He questions our ability to free our behavior from the legacy of our ancestors. And, he wonders what, if anything, we can do to influence the course of the centuries to come.

In Harari's ability to integrate history, science and human behavior, he challenges everything we thought we knew about being human.
